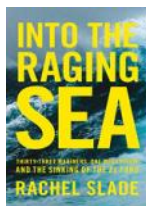

MOVIES AT MERRILL

In conjunction with the theme of this year's summer reading program, Libraries Rock, Merrill Film Society is screening some of the greatest rock and roll movies ever made.

July 11, 7 pm: The T.A.M.I. Show (1964),
123 minutes

The rock doc/concert film genre begins with *The T.A.M.I. Show*, the film of a concert held at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium in October 1964 featuring the rock stars of the day: Chuck Berry, Gerry & the Pacemakers, Jan & Dean, the Beach Boys, Smokey Robinson and the Miracles, the Supremes, Marvin Gaye, and Lesley Gore. Famously, the Rolling Stones were the last to go on, after James Brown already blew everyone's mind with what was "the single greatest rock 'n' roll performance ever captured on film," simply impossible for anyone to follow. A favorite film among rock enthusiasts.

July 25, 7 pm: Monterey Pop (1968),
79 minutes

Jimi, Janice, and Jefferson Airplane were among those who rocked the 1967 **Monterey Pop** Festival and the film of it that came out the following year. Along with them were Otis Redding, who didn't get many more chances to perform (he would die in a plane crash a few months later); The Mamas & the Papas; Scott McKenzie, whose "San Francisco" (penned by Papa John Phillips) defined the Summer of Love; Brits The Who and The Animals; Simon & Garfunkel; Canned Heat; Ravi Shankar; and Hugh Masekela, who died earlier this year. D.A. Pennebaker directed and had Albert Maysles and Richard Leacock on crew; they are the ones responsible for taking the images of Jimi Hendrix torching his guitar that are still so memorable 50 years later.

Monday Matinee

July 30, 1pm: Battle of the Sexes (2017)

The 1973 tennis match between Billie Jean King (Emma Stone) and Bobby Riggs (Steve Carell) became the most watched televised sports event of all time. Trapped in the media glare, King and Riggs were on opposite sides of a binary argument, but off-court each was fighting more personal and complex battles. With her husband urging her to fight for equal pay, the private King was also struggling to come to terms with her own sexuality, while Riggs gambled his legacy and reputation in a bid to relive the glories of his past.
